

Willington Football Club

Welcome to Willington Football Club, a volunteer run club providing grassroots football for Willington and the surrounding areas. We are affiliated to Derbyshire County Football Association and come under their jurisdiction for all football matters.

The largest organisation within our village with over 350 registered players and 60 volunteers, that include, committee members, managers, coaches, and helpers. All those involved have an important role in ensuring our club is run professionally. Match day and training facilities are at the Power Station football pitches and Twyford Road playing field.

A brief history ... Since its formation Willington FC had always provided our local community with adult football teams both on Saturday and Sunday and we could trace the clubs history back to just after the second World War. However, a recently received team photograph from a village resident shows a Willington United FC team from 1899 which has now made us re-write our club history.

In 2002 a junior section of the club was formed, initially starting the 2002/03 season with U12's and U10's teams that both played in the Burton Junior Football League. Our club now boasts teams from U6's through to Adults. 2022 sees us celebrating 20 years of junior football for Willington FC.

The forthcoming 2022/23 season will see our teams participating in seven leagues:

- Burton Junior Football Leagues
- Derby Junior Football League
- Midlands Junior Premier League
- Young Elizabethan League

- Derby City Football League
- Derby Taverners Sunday Football League
- Midlands Regional Alliance

Our emphasis is always about participation and we as a club fully support The FA For All, We Only Do Positive and Respect initiatives and would encourage anyone, no matter what ability level, to get involved in either playing football or volunteering to help run one of our numerous teams.

All team managers and coaches are FA DBS checked and hold a minimum of an FA Level 1 coaching qualification that includes safeguarding and first aid. Several coaches are also FA Level 2 qualified.

Accredited Part of England Football, formerly FA Charter Standard, is awarded to clubs and leagues who rigorously adjudged to be well-run and sustainable - and which prioritise child protection, quality coaching and implementation of the Respect programme.

We are pleased and proud to announce that once again Willington FC have been awarded their Accreditation status for the 2022/23 Season. An award we have held since 2012. A huge thank you goes out to all committee members, team managers and coaches for ensuring we are compliant.

Summer may have seemed like down time for the Neighbourhood Development Plan, but whilst we may have been distracted by the Queen's Jubilee, the Raft Race, the Carnival and other events work has been continuing behind the scenes.

Earlier this year the NDP group was tasked with looking critically at the village and highlighting those elements of open space, footpaths, views, canal side, riverside that were important elements of the village and which would need safeguarding in any future plan. This was then used to brief consultants, in May, and agree a brief for a "village appraisal". This has been an ongoing task for our consultants and we expect to receive their report within the next month.

Likewise our planning consultant, who is leading the project, has been liasing with South Derbyshire planners to try to establish a base line development need for the area and balance that against national needs/plans for housing growth, as well as demands from developers. It is a slow process, balancing need and demands which must also take the aspirations of the community into account.

We are expecting to be able to bring both these elements together in the next couple of months and gain an idea of what the future for the village might look like and how we might need to seek to further influence that future development.

This is regrettably a slow process with the ongoing unknowns of the power station's future role, the impact of the proposed Free Port development and the ongoing need for a new bridge over the River Trent; all of which could have an impact on the village. This seemingly lengthy process may seem frustrating to many but it is important to remember that we are now part of the plan process. Our task is to ensure that we have a voice in the future planning of the village and keep in step with and influence the plan process, rather than trying to dictate its pace and outcome.

Whilst we await the outcome of the consultant reports the NDP group still has much to do. We need to review the early work on what is important to the village in terms of village form and ensure that we have a priority list of the village elements that need protecting so we can react to whatever the consultants might recommend and ensure the community view is upheld.

You can also add your voice to the debate by letting us know what you feel is important to the village and how it may be best safeguarded against development.

STRONGER FOR LONGER Exercise for Strength & Balance




As we get older, doing regular physical activity, particularly exercise that improves our strength and balance, is a way to remain independent and reduce the risk of falls and injury. It can also give us more energy, help us sleep better and provide health benefits, such as strengthening bones, aiding blood pressure management and controlling blood sugar levels. Similarly, joining an exercise group, can get us out and about, meeting others, something we can all appreciate more since the lockdowns.

So, if you have noticed that you can't get out of a chair without using your arms, you need support while walking, or lack confidence to reach for something up high or down low, you would probably benefit from attending a local strength and balance class. Sessions include elements of cardio-fitness, exercises to strengthen muscles, balance training and stretching for flexibility. There are different sessions to meet differing abilities, you may be seated for much of the session, or you may do most of it standing. You would not be expected to work at a level which is uncomfortable for you. To ensure that they meet recognised standards, classes are approved by the 'Stronger for Longer' (Strictly No Falling Team) at Age UK Derby & Derbyshire - www.ageuk.org.uk/derbyandderbyshire/.

Everyone is welcome to borrow from our large selection of books – fiction and non-fiction – without charge. We also provide refreshments and a chance to have a chat.



Managing Willington Churchyard for Wildlife Benefit

Derbyshire Wildlife Trust advised a group of interested parishioners on how the regular mowing of Willington churchyard could be changed to be more beneficial to wildlife. This group suggested to the church managers that a part could be left uncut from around April to September, when the grass would be raked away for the usual mowing to continue.



In May the area of old graves in the north-east area was marked off from mowing , with notices to show that it is an intentional treatment and not what some parishioners might take to be neglect or disrespect simply because some of those graves are rarely visited.

It is hoped to repeat this arrangement again next year.
