Binding Edge

Hello and welcome to the May/June newsletter.

Spring has arrived and although the experts have said that it has been the warmest March on record, I think that we can all say it has certainly been one of the wettest few months that we have seen for a very long time. This has caused flash flooding and has caused havoc with the roads in our area, causing major issues with potholes in and around Willington.

Derbyshire County Council closed Repton Road for a few days and carried out much needed road repairs and also cleaned the drains adjacent to the church. They intend to close the road numerous times from now until September to complete the road repairs and check/maintain the gullies and drains.

The work to repair the gully by the Station Garden still hasn't been done. Planned work has been raised for the installation of an additional inspection chamber in the footway-to the rear of the carriageway gully adjacent to the Zebra crossing. This should allow improved access to the drainage system and further investigation is required. This is currently with Derbyshire County Council awaiting approval subject to budget in this financial year. We as a Parish Council will continue to put pressure on DCC to get the work completed as soon as possible.

The potholes on Findern Lane have now been filled in with the exception of one near the traffic lights which has been reported.

If you notice a pothole or other serious issue with our roads, please contact Derbyshire County Council direct by email at www.derbyshire.gov.uk and click on report a road fault. Their target is to make serious defects safe on busy roads within 32 hours.

The bus shelter on Repton Road opposite Hall Lane has now been fully glazed and provides much needed shelter from the wind and rain.

You may have noticed a memorial stone has been erected in the Station Garden between the two benches. This is a Remembrance Stone which has been installed by Willington WI. A plaque will be put on at a later date. Thank you to the WI for raising the money to purchase the stone and having it erected.

The application by McDonalds to build a 24-hour drive through and restaurant on the A38, on the opposite side of the slipway from the filling station just off Castleway has been refused by South Derbyshire District Council. McDonalds have the right to appeal the decision. If they do this will be heard by the HM Inspectorate.

Graham McCullach our Groundsman for many years has decided to reduce his workload due to him wanting to spend more time with his family during the summer.

Graham will continue to cut the hedges and litter pick around the village. We are pleased to announce that we have obtained the services of Border Patrol who are taking over the workload that Graham has relinquished - they started work in the village in April. FLOOD LIAISON GROUP



The Parish Council takes flooding within the village very seriously but we are limited on what we can do. The responsibility is with Derbyshire County Council (DCC), South Staffordshire Water (SSW) and South Derbyshire District Council (SDDC). DCC are responsible for closing roads and managing issues associated with highways, they are also responsible for ensuring drains and gullies are maintained and kept clean. They actually subcontract the cleaning to SDDC. SSW is responsible for any issues with the domestic water system including the pumping station located within the village. It can be quite confusing sometimes identifying who is responsible for what and the co-ordination between the responsible parties.

To this end the Parish Council has decided to set up a Flood Liaison Group, made up of volunteers from the Parish Council and Parishioners who have had issues with localised flooding or who just want to help within the village to alleviate the flooding. We would like to be more proactive by reporting issues with the relevant authorities to ensure gullies and drains are kept clean and free of debris and waterways are well maintained so that it enables them to take as much water away from the village as possible.

We would also like to set up a taskforce who can be called upon at these difficult times to assist in helping householders that are in difficulty and also to liaise with the representatives from the relevant authorities to co-ordinate activities within the village.

Why can I not get a GP appointment?

A question we hear regularly from patients and whilst there may be multiple reasons, a frequent factor is **DNA** patients: **DID NOT ATTEND**. In March 2024, we had **31 GP appointments not attended** and multiple other appointments missed with clinicians.

The surgery runs a process based on NHSE guidance -

- 1) If a patient does not attend an appointment (face-to-face or telephone) a letter is sent out to advise of ways to cancel appointments (allowing someone else to use it).
- 2) If the patient does not attend a second appointment (and this doesn't have to be with the same clinician, for example, it can be a GP appointment or a blood test) a second letter is sent advising of the appointments missed and setting out the consequences if any other appointment is missed.
- 3) Our policy is 3 missed appointments in a rolling 12-month period and you would be asked to find an alternative surgery.
