Since the carnival everything seems to have gone quiet in the village probably because we have all been away on our holidays. But now it's back to work, hello to autumn (perhaps a little earlier than we would have liked) and thoughts of bonfire night, pantos, and dare I mention Christmas !

But there is some more pressing business for the community. The Neighbourhood Plan Consultation, launched in July, ends on September 20th so I need to remind all of you (if you haven't already done so) to spend a little time to answer the questionnaire (delivered to all homes and available via the QR code) by September 20th. It is important that you let the Parish Council know what you think as this will affect the final plan.

Also there is a growing number of planning applications for Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) focused on access to the National Grid Distribution Station in Willington. Whilst the applications are currently outside the parish their impact on Willington will be considerable as each seeks to link to the Nations Grid by cabling along the main roads, further disrupting village life. The Parish Council will be objecting to these developments on the basis of the disruption to the village ... it would help if you could do the same.

Chairman's update

Hello and welcome to the September/October newsletter

I hope that everyone is enjoying the summer, it has been a long time coming after the long wet spring. The year seems to be going so fast, seeing the hay bales in the fields reminds me that the farmers are preparing for the coming winter.

The village centre is looking particularly colourful at the moment, many thanks to the businesses for the lovely displays outside of their premises and to the volunteers for the hard work that is put in around the Station and Station Garden to make the area colourful, bright and inviting for both residents and visitors alike.

A Community Questionnaire and a draft Neighbourhood development Plan has been delivered to every household in the village. It is really important that you have your say on how the village develops between now and 2040, you can fill it in online or hand it in at the Post Office or the Doctors surgery. Thank you to all that attended the open day at the Village Hall where the plan was available to view and Parish Councillors were in attendance to answer any questions. For those that could not attend, there is another one planned on Saturday 7th September at the Village Hall 1.00pm to 5.00pm.

Derbyshire Wildlife trust have opened their much awaited public footpath around the village on the 15th August. Willington parish council donated just over £4,000 to the cost of installing a bridge over the brook to assist DWT in completing the footpath. The footpath starts at Meadow Lane (Molly) and finishes near the entrance to Betty's Farm.

Work has recommenced on installing the new street lighting and removing the old ones, on Castleway. The work is expected to be completed by the end of August.

Derbyshire County Council has written to the Angling club instructing them to remove the gate that they erected over the Byway on Meadow lane (Molly). They are not allowed to obstruct a public highway. The club has until the 24th August to remove it.

Unfortunately we have not had an update from DCC with regards to the outstanding work required in the village, ie, repainting the pedestrian crossings, Repton road bridge repair, repair of the gulley on the pedestrian crossing by the Station Garden. We will continue to press them to complete the work and we will update you as soon as we get a reply.

Finally you may have noticed the village Community Speedwatch team operating around the village. These are all volunteers that help to keep our roads safe. Thank you to all involved.

The next WPC meeting will take place at the Old School on 10th September at 7pm. All are welcome to attend. Phill Allsopp



More about the ongoing saga of BESS and Willington John Orme writesIn the July/Aug 2024 edition of Willington Village News we told of the intention to build a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) on land at Egginton almost opposite Anoki restaurant. But that is only part of the picture regarding the impact of such BESS schemes.

We've all by now heard about the 400Kv superhighway for electricity which National Grid intend to construct between Chesterfield and Willington which will deliver electricity generated in the North Sea wind farms to the National Grid distribution station here in Willington. But wind farms can only produce electricity when the wind blows. Likewise no sunshine, no solar energy. So available power needs to be stored in some way for use when the weather is calm and the sun doesn't shine, hence the need for Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS), a key element in the transition to a smarter, more flexible energy system aiming to reach carbon net zero targets by 2050.

All planning applications for energy storage systems, regardless of size and capacity, are now determined in the first instance by the local planning authority (in Willington's case, South Derbyshire District Council). The National Planning Policy Framework directs that local planning authorities should generally urgently grant planning permission for infrastructure associated with renewable and low-carbon developments, such as Egginton's BESS, if its impacts are, or can be made acceptable, so as "to use energy more flexibly and de-carbonise our energy system cost-effectively".

The planning application (DMPA 2024/0432) for a BESS in Egginton is already being considered by SDDC, as we told you in July/Aug 2024 WVN. Nothing to do with Willington, you might think. However in order to connect this particular BESS to National Grid via Willington, the proposal includes trenching the whole length of A5132 Castleway and Twyford Road between the A38 and St Eligius Lane, to enable a connecting cable to be installed; the project is expected to last twelve months.

The National Planning Policy Framework and guidance tells us how authorities should identify "suitable areas" for the siting of BESS. It advises local authorities to consider "potential impacts of developments on the local environment and the views of local communities" But there are no specific policies, no "hard and fast rules".

Developers of all types of low-carbon energy infrastructure report long lead times for connection to the electricity transmission or distribution networks in Great Britain. The race to build BESS is on. And Willington's distribution station, by virtue of its coming supergrid connection, will be at the centre of such activity.

The UK's first appointed Electricity Networks Commissioner in August 2023 reported on accelerating electricity transmission network deployment, including recommendations to halve the connection time of new projects to around seven years. In response, the government published an action plan in November 2023, aimed for "a significant majority of projects" to be connected to the transmission network by the date they requested and to further reduce average delays to projects from five years to six months.

Watch for more BESS local planning applications in the next few months!

Apart from GPs, who else works in the surgery?

The NURSING TEAM comprises

4 PRACTICE NURSES who have many different skills alongside general nursing, inc. undertaking diabetic, asthma, learning disability and many other long-term condition reviews.

2 HEALTHCARE ASSISTANTS carry out a range of appointments including ear syringing, blood taking, ECG's and some wound dressings, and 1 PHLEBOTOMIST who is an expert in blood taking.

The CLINICAL PHARMACIST TEAM is made up of

2 CLINICAL PHARMACISTS who can independently prescribe medication. They work in the surgery to support medication and long-term condition reviews.

1 ADDITIONAL CLINICAL PHARMACIST who works remotely doing extended access between 6pm and 8pm for medication reviews.

A **PHARMACY TECHNICIAN** supports this team in the processing of prescriptions and reviewing of BP reading, etc.

OTHER CLINICAL ROLES include

FIRST CONTACT PHYSIOTHERAPIST works with patients who have muscle issues. They work as a GP would by triaging the issue and giving exercises and then reviewing to see if any additional physiotherapy or x-ray referrals are needed. Patients have access to both **SOCIAL PRESCRIBING AND HEALTH AND WELLBEING COACHES** who work with patients for non-medicalised support (mental and physical, e.g. grief management, debt management, pain management, etc.)

The NON-CLINICAL TEAM is led by Holly Goodrich, the PRACTICE MANAGER, and she is supported by an ASSISTANT PRACTICE MANAGER, a RECEPTION TEAM LEADER, and a LONG-TERM CONDITIONS MANAGER.

2 SECRETARIES process all referrals and private work.

A **DOCUMENT WORKFLOW TEAM** processes letters from hospital/other third parties.

The **RECEPTION TEAM** equates to 7.5 full-time members of staff. N.B. Many of the team work part-time.
