

## Chairman's update .....

Hello and welcome to the November/December newsletter

Thank you to everyone that filled in the Neighbourhood Development Plan Community questionnaire. The next step is to evaluate the comments and the findings and update the document as required. Once the document has been approved by Willington Parish Council it will then be subject to a referendum and if accepted it will be forwarded to South Derbyshire for adoption and it will form part of Local Plan parts I and II.

The update on the community building and changing room on Twyford road Playing field is that due to rising costs we have engaged a funding assistant to help us raise the additional funds required for the work to commence. We are looking to obtain grants from various sources. It is hoped that we will be able to commence the work around July 2025.

The street lighting on Castleway , the County Council has completed their scope. National Grid are due to complete the remainder of the work on 16<sup>th</sup> October.

The Angling club has removed the gate that was blocking the Byway. The posts are still in position but these are due for removal within the coming weeks.

Update on Willington bridge. Derbyshire County Council have been unable to retrieve the old stonework from the river, so quotes for new stone are being obtained. No date has been given for the completion; we will update you as soon as we have any more information.

The repainting of the pedestrian crossing, the mini roundabouts and some lining work around the centre of the village will take place on 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> October, weather permitting.


The gulley at the Station Garden crossing has been replaced with a section of pipework and a manhole has been installed. The system has improved, no surface water has been seen but further investigation is required to complete the work. DCC will inform us if any additional work is required.

The Parish Council will lay a Remembrance wreath at the church service on 10<sup>th</sup> November in honour of all the armed forces who lost their lives as a result of conflict. We will remember them.

May I take this opportunity to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a happy and healthy New Year.

The next WPC meeting will take place at the Old School on 12<sup>th</sup> November at 7pm. All are welcome to attend.





## The Dumbles Woodland

is now in its second year of being renewed and anyone visiting it over this period will have hopefully noticed its development and enhancement into a welcoming and peaceful woodland space.

The first year was spent uncovering the lost beauty from beneath brambles and rediscovering footpaths long since buried amongst fallen trees and nettles. These footpaths are now passable and meander around the woodland leading you into quiet leafy dells, alongside a tranquil pool or marshy glades. The area has been transformed from a foreboding and dark space to an accessible green space with dappled light and plenty of wildlife to clearly observe.

Year two has seen a fabulous stone path installed enabling easy all year passage through the area. Simple benches are now dotted around in key areas where a view of the pond or the tow path can be enjoyed under the tree canopy. Three main footpaths are marked with discreet paths leading off for those wanting to explore a little more.

Now when you wander through you may hear the chatter of excited children playing in what might seem to them an enchanted forest or the scampering of a dog as it navigates the myriad of paths and clearings. Importantly, for the majority of time, there is an opportunity to simply find a bench and reflect on the simple sights, sounds and smells that derive from a natural space.

The woodland is also now providing an environment for Wild Wellbeing sessions to help people struggling with their mental health. These sessions commenced in July 2023 and were led by the Derbyshire Wildlife Trust. With the help of a grant obtained in January 2024 through Derbyshire Mind and funded by Derbyshire County Council, we aim to offer more sessions to our local community, led by a team of trained facilitators. The training will be delivered by the Derbyshire Wildlife Trust and is due to take place over the coming months allowing the Wild Wellbeing sessions to commence in Spring 2025.

Those of us who volunteer to help keep the Dumbles accessible and tidy hope you can enjoy the space all year round.
